WANT TO SERVE ON THE BOARD?

The IASB Board of Directors is made up of instructors from media programs across the state. Each seat serves a two-year term. This year, the positions up for election are as follows:

President Secretary Vice President for Post-Secondary Education At Large for Secondary Education

Any of the instructors from the member schools are eligible to run. You can nominate yourself or nominate someone else. After a nomination is received, the person nominated is given an opportunity to accept or decline the nomination. Ballots are sent out in February to member schools to vote.

The board is responsible for planning all of the IASB member events such as the Spring Conference and Contest, the Summer Instructors' Workshop, and the Fall Members' Meeting. Board members also work on making sure that educational broadcasting gets a voice in relevant legislative measures. IASB has been working on collaborating with other broadcasting organizations around the state to expand what we can do for our students and member schools. Recently, IASB was successful in becoming a 501c3 organization with the future goal of developing new programming for students and programs.

As a board member, you would attend one virtual meeting a month (typically on the 2nd Wednesday of the month). There is also a board retreat in Indianapolis over two full days in July where much of the planning for the year takes place.

MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: COLUMBIA CITY HIGH SCHOOLWJHS

From streaming basketball games to revamping the on-air programming on The Eagle, the last couple years have not stopped WJHS from becoming a powerhouse in high school media. Columbia City High School currently has three class levels- Audio/Video, Communication, and Interactive Media.

Instructor, Jordan Glaza, brings 15 years of experience to the program having worked in Arizona, Florida, Michigan, and Indiana mainly as a media creative services and programming professional. Glaza says when he teaches, he wants students to be creative, plan and make their own decisions, and tries to impart that it is okay to make mistakes and improve over time.

Since taking over the program 3 years ago, Glaza has been most proud of his students wanting to explore AV and be creators. This year, his Interactive Media students tried out animation for the first time. Admittedly, some of the projects fell apart, especially with stop motion, but his students put in a ton of effort and got to create something they were really proud of!

Students in the program now get to run the basketball stream and Glaza said they took it on themselves to create their own 'work-calendar'. WJHS interns that are working on digitizing their archives for the benefit of their community and alumni.
